## 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 **Consumer Protection Act for Wheeled Mobility**

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain residential service agencies to meet certain
- requirements as a condition of licensure; specifying certain residential service 4
- 5 agencies that are subject to this Act; requiring certain residential service
- 6 agencies to employ qualified rehabilitation professionals; requiring certain
- 7 residential service agencies to ensure that qualified rehabilitation professionals
- 8 meet certain requirements and perform certain duties; requiring certain
- 9 residential service agencies to apply for or obtain certain accreditation on or
- 10 before a certain date; providing a certain exception to the requirements for
- certain residential service agencies regarding the employment of qualified 11
- rehabilitation professionals under certain circumstances; requiring individuals 12
- 13 to obtain certain professional or educational credentials in order to act as a
- 14 qualified rehabilitation professional; requiring qualified rehabilitation
- 15 professionals to perform a certain technology assessment of certain consumers;
- requiring qualified rehabilitation professionals to document in writing certain 16
- 17 recommendations; requiring qualified rehabilitation professionals to perform
- 18 the final fitting of a wheeled mobility system for a consumer; requiring certain
- 19 consumers to undergo a physical evaluation by certain health care practitioners
- 20 and submit a written report of the physical evaluation to a qualified
- rehabilitation practitioner prior to obtaining a technology assessment for a 21
- 22 wheeled mobility system; requiring the Department of Health and Mental
- 23 Hygiene to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; providing for a
- delayed effective date; and generally relating to residential service agencies and 24
- 25 the regulation of the sale, service, and instruction in the use of wheeled mobility

- 1 Section 19-4B-01 through 19-4B-08, inclusive, to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 4B. Consumer Protection Act for Wheeled Mobility" 2 3 Annotated Code of Maryland (2000 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement) 4 5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 7 **Article - Health - General** 8 19-4A-05. 9 To qualify for a license, an applicant: 10 Shall show that the residential service agency will provide 11 appropriate home health care providers to sick or disabled individuals who may be 12 provided care in the individual's residence, instead of in a hospital; 13 SHALL MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBTITLE 4B OF THIS TITLE IF (2) 14 THE RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY SELLS, SERVICES, OR INSTRUCTS CONSUMERS 15 IN THE USE OF WHEELED MOBILITY SYSTEMS, IF THE CONSUMER MEETS THE 16 CRITERIA SPECIFIED UNDER § 19-4B-02 OF THIS TITLE; 17 Shall meet any additional requirements that the Department [(2)](3) 18 adopts; and 19 [(3)](4) May not be required to meet the requirements of Subtitle 1 of 20 this title for certificate of need. "ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY SUPPLIER" MEANS A SERVICE PROVIDER 29 (C) 30 INVOLVED IN THE SALE, SERVICE, OR INSTRUCTION OF CONSUMERS IN THE USE OF 31 COMMERCIALLY AVAILABLE WHEELED MOBILITY SYSTEMS. 32 (D) "CONSUMER" MEANS THE ULTIMATE RECIPIENT OR USER OF A WHEELED
- 33 MOBILITY SYSTEM THAT HAS BEEN PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN.

- 1 (E) "HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER" MEANS ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO IS
- 2 LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED UNDER THE HEALTH
- 3 OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE SERVICES.
- 4 (F) "PHYSICAL EVALUATION" MEANS A DETERMINATION AND
- 5 DOCUMENTATION OF THE PHYSIOLOGICAL AND FUNCTIONAL FACTORS THAT
- 6 IMPACT THE SELECTION OF AN APPROPRIATE SEATING AND WHEELED MOBILITY
- 7 SYSTEM.
- 8 (G) "OUALIFIED REHABILITATION PROFESSIONAL" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL
- 9 WHO MEETS THE CRITERIA SPECIFIED UNDER § 19-4B-05 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 10 (H) "REHABILITATION ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGIST" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL
- 11 WHO APPLIES ENGINEERING PRINCIPLES TO THE DESIGN, MODIFICATION,
- 12 CUSTOMIZATION, OR FABRICATION OF WHEELED MOBILITY SYSTEMS.
- 13 (I) "TECHNOLOGY ASSESSMENT" MEANS THE PROCESS AND
- 14 DOCUMENTATION OF MATCHING THE PATHOLOGY, HISTORY, AND PROGNOSIS OF A
- 15 CONSUMER TO THE APPROPRIATE WHEELED MOBILITY SYSTEM.
- 16 (J) "WHEELED MOBILITY SYSTEM" MEANS A MANUAL OR POWER-OPERATED
- 17 MOBILITY SYSTEM PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN AND REQUIRED FOR USE BY THE
- 18 PATIENT FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 6 MONTHS THAT MAY INCLUDE:
- 19 (1) ALTERNATIVE DRIVING CONTROLS;
- 20 (2) MANUAL OR POWER SEATING OPTIONS:
- 21 (3) MULTIADJUSTMENT FRAME;
- 22 (4) NONSTANDARD PERFORMANCE OPTIONS;
- 23 (5) SEATED POSITIONING COMPONENTS; OR
- 24 (6) OTHER COMPLEX OR SPECIALIZED COMPONENTS.
