24 ~~(a) After the conviction of an individual for a violation of Title 2, Subtitle 5, §~~
 25 ~~2-209, or § 3-211 of the Criminal Law Article, or of the vehicle laws or regulations of~~
 26 ~~this State or of any local authority, points shall be assessed against the individual as~~
 27 ~~of the date of violation and as follows:~~

30 (a) If a school vehicle has stopped on a roadway and is operating the
 31 alternately flashing red lights specified in § 22-228 of this article, the driver of any
 32 other vehicle meeting or overtaking the school vehicle shall stop at least 20 feet from
 33 the rear of the school vehicle, if approaching the school vehicle from its rear, or at
 34 least 20 feet from the front of the school vehicle, if approaching the school vehicle
 35 from its front.

1 (b) If a school vehicle has stopped on a roadway and is operating the
2 alternately flashing red lights specified in § 22-228 of this article, the driver of any
3 other vehicle meeting or overtaking the school vehicle may not proceed until the
4 school vehicle resumes motion or the alternately flashing red lights are deactivated.

5 (c) This section does not apply to the driver of a vehicle on a divided highway,
6 if the school vehicle is on a different roadway.

8 (g) Any person who is convicted of a violation of any of the [provisions of §
9 13-704 of this article or § 21-901.1(a) of this article ("Reckless driving")] FOLLOWING
10 SECTIONS OF THIS ARTICLE is subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000:

11 (1) § 13-704 ("FRAUD IN APPLICATION");

12 (2) § 21-706 ("OVERTAKING AND PASSING SCHOOL VEHICLE"); OR

13 (3) § 21-901.1(A) ("RECKLESS DRIVING").
