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### Preamble

WHEREAS, Community and faith-based organizations are uniquely able to provide services to Maryland citizens in need of assistance in meeting basic human needs; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly has long recognized the ability of community and faith-based organizations to provide services to citizens and has partnered with these organizations with capital improvements through legislative initiatives in the State capital budget; and

WHEREAS, Partnerships between the State and community and faith-basedorganizations facilitate the seamless provision of human services; and

	WHEREAS, The General Assembly intends to continue to provide financial assistance to community and faith-based organizations that provide human services; and
6	WHEREAS, A mechanism is needed to connect community and faith-based organizations and State agencies to better enable them to exchange information, coordinate resources, provide technical assistance, and serve as a clearinghouse to help meet the human services needs of Maryland citizens; now, therefore,

1(8)SIX REPRESENTATIVES OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, APPOINTED BY2THE GOVERNOR FROM A LIST OF 10 NAMES SUBMITTED BY THE MARYLAND3ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES;

4 (9) SIX REPRESENTATIVES OF FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS THAT 5 PROVIDE HUMAN SERVICES, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR; AND

6 (10) SIX REPRESENTATIVES OF NONPROFIT, COMMUNITY
7 ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE HUMAN SERVICES, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR

 12 RACIAL, GENDER, AND RELIGIOUS DIVERSITY IN THE COUNCIL'S MEMBERSHIP.

13 (D) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL.

14 (E) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR IS 3 YEARS.

15 (2) THE TERMS OF APPOINTED MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS
16 REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL ON OCTOBER
17 1, 2004.

18 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A19 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

20(4)A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES21ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

(F) THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, THE DEPARTMENT OF
HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE
JUSTICE, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, AND THE OFFICE
FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES SHALL JOINTLY PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT TO
THE COUNCIL.

27 (G) A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION BUT IS
28 ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE
29 TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(6) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, REPORT TO THE
GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT
ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE ACTIVITIES AND RECOMMENDATIONS
OF THE COUNCIL.

27 members of the Community and Faith-Based Partnership Council who are appointed
