Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System - Membership - Salisbury Fire Department

4 FOR the purpose of providing that certain firefighters and paramedics who are

- 5 employed by the Salisbury Fire Department are eligible for membership in the
- 6 Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System under certain circumstances;
- 7 specifying the procedural requirements that a certain participating
- 8 governmental unit must meet to have its firefighters or paramedics participate
- 9 in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; and generally relating to
- 10 pensions for firefighters and paramedics who are employed by the Salisbury
- 11 Fire Department.

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Preamble

WHEREAS, The recruitment and retention of qualified and trained firefighters,
emergency medical technicians, and paramedics is competitive and often influenced
by employee benefits; and

21 WHEREAS, The opportunity for promotion and mobility within any emergency 22 services organization is influenced by the available retirement options; and

WHEREAS, A recent survey has shown that the retirement benefits available to employees in the Salisbury Fire Department are not competitive with benefits available in other fire departments in the region; and

26 WHEREAS, In order to encourage timely retirement for fire department

27 members, retain members who are not yet ready to retire, and aid in the attraction of

28 new members, it is necessary for the Salisbury Fire Department to offer an adequate

5 (A) If at least 60% of the law enforcement officers of an eligible governmental 6 unit who are members of a local pension system petition to become members of the 7 Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, the legislative body of the eligible 8 governmental unit may approve the participation of these law enforcement officers in 9 the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as though the local pension system 10 were not in operation.

18 If a law enforcement officer, FIREFIGHTER, OR PARAMEDIC joins the Law 19 Enforcement Officers' Pension System within 6 months after the effective date, the 20 member is entitled to credit for employment with the participating governmental unit 21 before the effective date.

(a) If an eligible governmental unit approves participation in the Law
 Enforcement Officers' Pension System, the operation of the local pension system with
 respect to the law enforcement officers, FIREFIGHTERS, OR PARAMEDICS terminates
 on the effective date.

27 (b) (1) On the effective date:

(i) the assets to the credit of the local pension system that relate to
the law enforcement officers, FIREFIGHTERS, OR PARAMEDICS who elect to become
members shall be transferred to the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; and

(ii) the trustee or other administrative head of the local pension
system shall certify the proportion of the funds of the local pension system that
represents the accumulated contributions of the members as of that date.

35 annuity savings accounts of the members in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension

37 (3) The balance of the funds transferred to the Law Enforcement
