## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Education - Closing the Gap School Recognition Awards

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Closing the Gap School Recognition Awards
- 4 program to recognize primary and secondary schools which have made
- 5 significant efforts in reducing certain achievement gaps for certain students;
- 6 requiring the Governor to include a certain amount of certain funds in the
- 7 annual State budget under certain circumstances to fund the awards program;
- 8 requiring the State Superintendent to distribute award funds to certain schools
- 9 under certain circumstances; requiring the State Superintendent to establish
- 10 certain guidelines for determining the eligibility for and distribution of award
- funds; requiring the State Department of Education to annually determine and
- 12 report to the General Assembly, State Board, and county boards the primary and
- secondary schools that have made gains in reducing certain achievement gaps
- 14 for certain students; requiring certain recipient schools to determine how award
- funds shall be used to further reduce achievement gaps subject to certain
- limitations; requiring the principal of a recipient school to file a certain report

- 6 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 5-211 of Article Education of the Annotated Code of

- 12 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 13 INDICATED.
- 14 (2) "AWARD" MEANS A CLOSING THE GAP SCHOOL RECOGNITION AWARD.
- 15 (3) "NCLB ACT" MEANS THE FEDERAL NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT.
- 16 (4) "RECIPIENT SCHOOL" MEANS A PUBLIC SCHOOL THAT RECEIVES AN 17 AWARD UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 18 (B) (1) IT IS THE INTENT OF THIS SECTION TO RECOGNIZE INDIVIDUAL
- 19 SCHOOLS WHICH HAVE MADE SIGNIFICANT EFFORTS IN REDUCING THE
- 20 ACHIEVEMENT GAPS FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN AND LATINO STUDENTS IN STATE
- 21 SCHOOLS AS DEMONSTRATED BY DATA REPORTED TO THE DEPARTMENT IN
- 22 ACCORDANCE WITH THE FEDERAL NCLB ACT.
- 23 (2) INDIVIDUAL SCHOOLS MAY BE RECOGNIZED THROUGH RECEIPT OF
- 24 "CLOSING THE GAP SCHOOL RECOGNITION AWARDS".
- 25 (C) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET SUBMISSION
- 26 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006 AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER \$2,750,000 FOR AWARDS TO BE
- 27 FUNDED FROM THE STATE-LEVEL RESERVE ALLOCATIONS FOR SCHOOL
- 28 IMPROVEMENT ACTIVITIES SPECIFIED BY THE FEDERAL TITLE I GRANTS TO LOCAL
- 29 EDUCATION AGENCIES.
- 30 (D) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT ANNUALLY SHALL DISTRIBUTE AWARDS TO
- 31 ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS THAT SHOW SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT
- 32 IN REDUCING ACHIEVEMENT GAPS BASED ON RELEVANT INDICATORS SPECIFIED IN
- 33 THE NCLB ACT.
- 34 (E) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE STATE
- 35 SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY
- 36 FOR AND DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION.

## **HOUSE BILL 1280**

- (I) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ANNUALLY DETERMINE AND REPORT (2) 2 TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, STATE BOARD, AND COUNTY BOARDS THOSE PRIMARY 3 AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS THAT HAVE MADE THE HIGHEST GAINS IN REDUCING 4 ACHIEVEMENT GAPS FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN AND LATINO STUDENTS IN STATE 5 PUBLIC SCHOOLS. THE AWARD CRITERIA SHOULD BE BASED ON THE MANDATED 6 7 DISAGGREGATED ACHIEVEMENT GAP INDICATORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NCLB 8 ACT, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO: REDUCED GAPS OR SIGNIFICANT GAINS TOWARD ZERO 1. 10 GAP IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL READING AND MATH ASSESSMENTS BY THE THIRD 11 GRADE: 12 REDUCED GAP IN THE NUMBER OF AFRICAN AMERICAN 13 AND LATINO MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN PRE-ALGEBRA OR 14 ALGEBRA AND HONORS/ADVANCED COURSES; REDUCED GAP IN THE NUMBER OF AFRICAN AMERICAN 15 3. 16 AND LATINO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN HONORS AND ADVANCED 17 PLACEMENT COURSES; AND SIGNIFICANT GAINS TOWARD ZERO GAP IN GRADUATION. 18 4. 19 DROPOUT, AND SUSPENSION RATES AMONG ALL RACIAL AND ETHNIC HIGH SCHOOL 20 STUDENTS. (F) A RECIPIENT SCHOOL SHALL DETERMINE HOW THE AWARD SHALL (1) 22 BE USED TO FURTHER REDUCTION OF ACHIEVEMENT GAPS SUBJECT TO THE 23 FOLLOWING CONDITIONS: 24 (I) AWARD FUNDS ARE IN ADDITION TO AND MAY NOT SUPPLANT 25 FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL FUNDS REGULARLY APPROPRIATED FOR USE BY THE 26 SCHOOL; AWARD FUNDS MAY NOT BE USED FOR: 27 (II)28 1. STAFF BONUSES; 29 2. DIFFERENTIAL PAY INCREASES; OR 30 3. TECHNOLOGY; AND AWARD FUNDS SHALL BE EXPENDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 31 32 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES OF THE SCHOOL SYSTEM WHERE THE RECIPIENT 33 SCHOOL IS LOCATED. THE PRINCIPAL OF THE RECIPIENT SCHOOL SHALL FILE A REPORT (2)
- 35 WITH THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT INDICATING THE AMOUNT AND USES OF THE
- 36 AWARD FUNDS BY THE RECIPIENT SCHOOL.

- 1 (3) THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT SHALL FILE A REPORT WITH THE
- $2\,$  COUNTY BOARD, THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT, AND THE STATE BOARD INDICATING
- 3 THE AMOUNTS AND USES OF THE AWARD FUNDS BY EACH RECIPIENT SCHOOL IN
- 4 THE SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2004.
