29 WHEREAS, William Donald Schaefer, a lifelong Maryland resident, has held

30 elective public office in State and local government in Maryland for 45 years, having

- 1 served for 12 years as a member of the Baltimore City Council from 1955 to 1967, for
- 2 4 years as President of the Baltimore City Council from 1967 to 1971, for 15 years as
- 3 Mayor of the City of Baltimore from 1971 to 1986, for 8 years as Governor from 1987
- 4 to 1995 and, after a brief hiatus, most recently, for the past 5 years as State
- 5 Comptroller since 1999; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In addition to his service as an elected official, Mr. Schaefer has
- 7 endeavored to share his passion for public service with individuals who aspire to take
- 8 up that mantel, as evidenced by his appointment to the Schaefer Chair at the
- 9 University of Maryland's School of Public Affairs in conjunction with the Johns
- 10 Hopkins University Institute for Policy Studies, and as further evidenced by his
- 11 involvement with numerous civic and charitable organizations and service on the
- 12 boards of several nonprofit organizations and institutions of higher education in the
- 13 State; and
- WHEREAS, It is in the State's interest to encourage young people to pursue
- 15 education and training that leads to employment opportunities in public service at all
- 16 levels of government; and
- 17 WHEREAS, It is most fitting that William Donald Schaefer, whose career is a
- 18 shining example of the rewards and challenges that may be experienced by a life
