3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

6 10-301.

7 (a) To provide a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing wildlife,

8 and preventing unauthorized persons from hunting them, a person may not hunt or

9 attempt to hunt during open season and in any permitted manner any game birds and

10 mammals in the State without first having procured either a resident or nonresident

11 hunter's license. A person may not hunt or attempt to hunt nongame birds and

12 mammals in Baltimore County or Frederick County without first obtaining a license.

13 A permanent resident of a government reservation may obtain a resident hunter's14 license.

15 (b) [(1)] The following persons are not required to obtain a hunter's license or 16 bonus antlered deer stamp:

17 [(i)] (1) With respect to hunting on farmland only:

18 [1.] (I) [Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this

19 subsection, the] THE RESIDENT owner of the farmland and the owner's spouse,

23 lease, or a sharecropper who resides in a dwelling on the land, but a tenant does not

24 include any employee of the owner or tenant; AND
