- 7 certain monument a cemetery owned by the State; prohibiting the transfer or
- 8 sale of certain easements or rights of entry; providing that a cemetery or an
- 9 easement or right of entry to a cemetery owned by the State and located on the
- 10 grounds of a State facility may be sold under certain circumstances; defining a
- certain term; and generally relating to State-owned cemeteries located on the

10	(A) IN THIS SECTION, "STATE FACILITY" MEANS:
	(1) A FACILITY MAINTAINED BY THE MENTAL HYGIENE ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE AND LISTED IN § 10-406 OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE; OR
	(2) A STATE RESIDENTIAL CENTER FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH MENTAL RETARDATION IN THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE.
	(A) (B) A CEMETERY OWNED BY THE STATE AND LOCATED ON THE GROUNDS OF A STATE FACILITY MAY NOT BE SOLD BY THE STATE IF THE STATE FACILITY IS DOWNSIZED, CONSOLIDATED, <u>CLOSED</u> , OR SOLD.
	(\underline{B}) (\underline{C}) A CEMETERY OWNED BY THE STATE SHALL BE MAINTAINED BY THE STATE AND MARKED WITH A MONUMENT COMMEMORATING THE INDIVIDUALS INTERRED IN THE CEMETERY.
25	(C) (D) ANY EASEMENT OR RIGHT OF ENTRY TO A CEMETERY OWNED BY THE STATE AND LOCATED ON THE GROUNDS OF A STATE FACILITY THAT HAS BEEN RECORDED AMONG THE LAND RECORDS OF THE COUNTY WHERE THE CEMETERY IS LOCATED ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2004 MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED OR SOLD.
29	(E) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTIONS (B) AND (D) OF THIS SECTION, A CEMETERY OR AN EASEMENT OR RIGHT OF ENTRY TO A CEMETERY OWNED BY THE STATE AND LOCATED ON THE GROUNDS OF A STATE FACILITY MAY BE SOLD BY THE STATE IF THE DEED FOR THE PROPERTY INCLUDES A RESTRICTIVE COVENANT

31 REQUIRING THE OWNER AND ANY FUTURE OWNER TO MAINTAIN THE CEMETERY AS

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
