## 2 Elections - Voting Equipment or Supplies - Penalties

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the penalty for the violation of certain provisions of the
- 4 State election law relating to voting equipment and supplies; and generally

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 18 Article - Election Law

- 19 16-801.
- 20 (a) A person may not willfully:
- 21 (1) conceal, damage, or destroy voting equipment used or intended to be
- 22 used on the day of election; or
- 23 (2) remove voting equipment from the custody of the election judges or
- 24 other election officials.

- 1 A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and is subject to A (b) 2 FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$50,000 OR imprisonment for not [less than 1 year nor] 3 more than [5] 10 years OR BOTH.
- 4 16-802.
- 5 (a) A person may not willfully and knowingly:
- tamper with, damage, or attempt to damage any voting equipment 6 (1) 7 that is used or will be used in an election; or
- 8 prevent or attempt to prevent the correct operation of any voting 9 equipment that is used or will be used on the day of election.
- 10 An unauthorized person may not make or have in the person's possession a 11 key to any voting equipment that is used or will be used on the day of election.
- 12 A person who violates this section is guilty of a [misdemeanor] FELONY 13 and is subject to a fine of not more than [\$1,000] \$50,000 or imprisonment for not
- 14 more than [1 year] 10 YEARS or both.
- 15 16-803.
- A person may not remove, deface, or destroy equipment or supplies placed 17 in a polling place by election officials during an election.
- 18 A person who violates this section is GUILTY OF A FELONY AND IS subject
- 19 to a fine of not more than [\$500] \$50,000 or imprisonment for not more than [1 year]
- 20 10 YEARS or both.
- 21 16-804.
- 22 When an electronic voting system is used, a person may not willfully and (a)
- 23 knowingly:
- access the system unless authorized to do so by the appropriate 24 (1)
- 25 election authority; or
- tamper with or alter the hardware, system components, or software 26 (2)
- 27 utilized by the voting system, for the purpose of affecting the vote count.
- A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction 28
- 29 shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$50,000 or imprisonment for not more than
- 30 10 years or both.
- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 32 October 1, 2004.
