18 (a) (1) An official or employee may not intentionally use the prestige of 19 office or public position for that official's or employee's private gain or that of another.

20 [(b)] (2) The performance of usual and customary constituent services,

21 without additional compensation, is not prohibited under [subsection (a) of this

22 section] PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

(B) DURING THE SOLICITATION AND PRIOR TO THE AWARD OF A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT, AN OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE MAY NOT INTENTIONALLY USE THE PRESTIGE OF OFFICE OR PUBLIC POSITION FOR THE PRIVATE GAIN OF:
