SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
July 1, 2004. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 10 years and, at the end of June</u>
<u>30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be</u>
<u>abrogated and of no further force and effect.</u>
