## 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Education - Full-Day Kindergarten - Extension

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county board of education or county governing body
- 4 to apply to the State Superintendent of Schools for an extension of a certain
- 5 full-day kindergarten program requirement under certain circumstances;
- 6 requiring the State Superintendent to consider certain factors in determining
- 7 whether to grant an extension; requiring the State Superintendent to issue a
- 8 decision within a certain amount of time; allowing a county board or county
- 9 governing body to file an appeal with the Board of Public Works if the State
- Superintendent denies the extension request; requiring the Board of Public
- Works to schedule an appeal hearing and issue a decision in a certain amount of
- time; providing that if an extension is granted, funding for kindergarten
- students shall be based on a certain equivalent status; and generally relating to
- authorizing a county board of education or county governing body to apply to the
- 15 State Superintendent for an extension of the full-day kindergarten program

- 27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 28 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 1 **Article - Education** 2 7-101. 3 (e) By the 2007-2008 school year, each county board shall provide 4 full-day kindergarten programs for all kindergarten students in that county. 5 In the comprehensive master plan that is submitted under § 5-401 of (2) 6 this article, a county board shall identify the strategies that will be used in that 7 county to ensure that full-day kindergarten programs are provided to all 8 kindergarten students in that county by the 2007-2008 school year OR IN 9 ACCORDANCE WITH AN EXTENSION GRANTED UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS 10 SECTION. 11 (F) A COUNTY BOARD REQUIRED TO PROVIDE OR A COUNTY 12 GOVERNING BODY REQUIRED TO FUND FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS 13 UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION MAY REQUEST AN EXTENSION OF THIS 14 REQUIREMENT FROM THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT. 15 A COUNTY BOARD OR COUNTY GOVERNING BODY MAY NOT (II)16 REQUEST AN EXTENSION FOR SCHOOLS LOCATED IN CRITICAL NEEDS AREAS OR 17 LOW SOCIOECONOMIC AREAS AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT. A COUNTY BOARD OR COUNTY GOVERNING BODY MAY NOT (III)19 REQUEST AN EXTENSION BEYOND THE 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR. IN DETERMINING WHETHER TO GRANT AN EXTENSION OF THE 21 REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE 22 SUPERINTENDENT SHALL CONSIDER: 23 (I) THE CURRENT CAPACITY AND CAPABILITY OF EXISTING 24 SCHOOLS TO ACCOMMODATE FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS; 25 THE ACTUAL CAPITAL AND OPERATING COST TO THE COUNTY (II)26 TO MEET THE REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION; (III)THE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION DEBT CAPACITY OF THE COUNTY; 27 28 AND (IV) THE FEASIBILITY AND AVAILABILITY OF ALTERNATIVE SITES 30 AND FINANCING TO ACCOMMODATE THE FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS. THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ISSUE A DECISION 31 (3) (I) 32 WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE RECEIPT OF A REOUEST FOR AN EXTENSION BY A 33 COUNTY BOARD OR COUNTY GOVERNING BODY. 34 (II)IF THE EXTENSION REQUEST IS DENIED, THE STATE 35 SUPERINTENDENT SHALL PROVIDE WRITTEN JUSTIFICATION FOR THE DENIAL TO 36 THE COUNTY BOARD OR COUNTY GOVERNING BODY.

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- (III)IF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT DOES NOT ISSUE A DECISION 2 WITHIN 60 DAYS, THE EXTENSION REQUEST SHALL BE CONSIDERED DENIED AND 3 THE COUNTY BOARD OR COUNTY GOVERNING BODY MAY APPEAL TO THE BOARD OF 4 PUBLIC WORKS. IF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT DENIES A REQUEST FOR AN (I) 6 EXTENSION UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A COUNTY BOARD OR THE 7 COUNTY GOVERNING BODY MAY APPEAL TO THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS WITHIN 8 30 DAYS AFTER THE DECISION OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT. (II)THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL SCHEDULE AN APPEAL 10 FOR A HEARING WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE APPEAL IS FILED. 11 (III)IN DETERMINING WHETHER TO GRANT AN EXTENSION OF THE 12 REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD OF PUBLIC 13 WORKS SHALL CONSIDER:
- 14 1. THE CURRENT CAPACITY AND CAPABILITY OF EXISTING 15 SCHOOLS TO ACCOMMODATE FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS;
- 16 2. THE ACTUAL CAPITAL AND OPERATING COST TO THE 17 COUNTY TO MEET THE REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION;
- 18 3. THE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION DEBT CAPACITY OF THE
- 19 COUNTY; AND
- 20 4. THE FEASIBILITY AND AVAILABILITY OF ALTERNATIVE 21 SITES AND FINANCING TO ACCOMMODATE THE FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN
- 22 STUDENTS.
- 23 (IV) THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL ISSUE A DECISION
- 24 WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE HEARING.
- 25 (V) IF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS DOES NOT ISSUE A DECISION
- 26 WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE FILING OF AN APPEAL, THE EXTENSION REQUEST SHALL
- 27 BE CONSIDERED GRANTED.
- 28 (5) IF AN EXTENSION IS GRANTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OR (4) OF THIS
- 29 SUBSECTION, FUNDING FOR KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS UNDER § 5-202 OF THIS
- 30 ARTICLE SHALL BE BASED ON THEIR EQUIVALENT STATUS AS HALF-DAY STUDENTS.
- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 32 effect July 1, 2004.
