3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Dredge Dredged Material Disposal Alternatives

- 4 Program within the Department of Business and Economic Development;
- 5 providing for the purposes, goals, and activities of the Program; requiring the
- 6 Department of Business and Economic Development to seek certain moneys for
- 7 the Program; making the Program contingent on the allocation to the Program
- 8 of a certain percentage of the money appropriated in the State budget to the
- 9 Maryland Port Administration for certain uses Department of Transportation;
- 10 requiring the Maryland Department of Transportation to allocate certain money
- 11 appropriated to it after certain conditions are met; requiring the Administration
- 12 to be responsible for transporting and the costs of transporting <u>dredge</u> <u>dredged</u>
- 13 material to certain facilities; defining certain terms; requiring recipients of
- 14 financial assistance from the Program to submit certain reports on a certain
- basis to the Department of Business and Economic Development; authorizing
- 16 the Department to impose terms and conditions on financial assistance provided
- 17 from the Program; <u>requiring</u>, on or before a certain date, the Maryland

Preamble

WHEREAS, The shipping channels for the Port of Baltimore, including the main
channels and anchorages in and adjacent to the Chesapeake Bay and its approaches,
must undergo dredging in order to maintain channel depth necessary for the
economic viability of the Port; and

10 WHEREAS, <u>Dredge</u> <u>Dredged</u> material has economic value and is a sustainable, 11 replenishable resource; and

WHEREAS, There is a pressing need to work within a climate of limited
financial resources to fulfill the stewardship responsibilities for the infrastructure of
Maryland's water resources; and

WHEREAS, Innovative solutions can facilitate the successful management of
materials dredged from the Chesapeake Bay and the Port of Baltimore, create jobs
and economic growth, and retain existing jobs; and

18 WHEREAS, The beneficial reuse and conversion of dredge dredged material

 $19\,$ into end products that have economic value will result in a self-sustaining program

20 for the reuse of dredge dredged material and in the creation of renewable dredge

21 dredged material disposal options for future maritime disposal needs; now, therefore,

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

27 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS28 INDICATED.

29 (B) "DREDGE <u>DREDGED</u> MATERIAL" MEANS SAND, SILT, SEDIMENT, SHELL,
30 ROCK, SOIL, WASTE MATTER, OR OTHER MATERIAL EXCAVATED OR DREDGED FROM
31 THE CHESAPEAKE BAY AND ITS TRIBUTARY WATERS.

32 (C) "DREDGE <u>DREDGED</u> MATERIAL REUSE FACILITY" MEANS A FACILITY THAT 33 DEWATERS, ANALYZES FOR CONTAMINANTS, DRIES, AND PROCESSES DREDGE

34 <u>DREDGED</u> MATERIAL FOR REUSE IN AN ECONOMICALLY BENEFICIAL MANNER.

(D) "REUSE" MEANS THE RECYCLING OF DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL FOR
 ITS USE IN ANOTHER PRODUCT, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, COMMERCIAL
 AND INDUSTRIAL USES.

5 (A) THERE IS A DREDGE <u>DREDGED</u> MATERIAL DISPOSAL ALTERNATIVES 6 PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.

7 (B) (1) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO:

8 (I) DESIGNATE INNOVATIVE REUSES OF DREDGE DREDGED
9 MATERIAL AS A SUSTAINABLE ALTERNATIVE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF DREDGE
10 DREDGED MATERIAL DISPOSAL; AND

(II) PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO INDIVIDUALS AND
 BUSINESS ENTERPRISES FOR THE PRODUCTION AND MARKETING OF
 TECHNOLOGIES THAT DEWATER, ANALYZE FOR CONTAMINANTS, DRY, AND PROCESS
 DREDGE <u>DREDGED</u> MATERIAL FOR REUSE IN AN ECONOMICALLY BENEFICIAL
 MANNER.

16 (2) THE GOALS OF THE PROGRAM ARE TO:

17 (I) IMPLEMENT BENEFICIAL REUSE OF DREDGE DREDGED
18 MATERIALS AS A SUSTAINABLE DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL MANAGEMENT
19 METHOD;

20 (II) FOSTER MARKETS FOR END USE PRODUCTS THAT USE DREDGE 21 <u>DREDGED</u> MATERIAL AS A RESOURCE;

(III) INCREASE PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THE MANY VALUABLE
 COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL USES OF DREDGED MATERIAL AND
 PRODUCTS THAT ARE PRODUCED USING DREDGED MATERIAL; AND

25 (IV) FACILITATE THE REUSE OF AT LEAST 500,000 CUBIC YARDS OF
 26 DREDGED MATERIAL EACH YEAR.

27 (C) THE PROGRAM SHALL:

28 (1) SEEK MONEYS AVAILABLE THROUGH FEDERAL PROGRAMS TO BE29 USED IN ADMINISTERING THE PROGRAM;

(2) ENGAGE IN PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS AND PROVIDE
 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO FOSTER THE DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND
 OPERATION OF DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL REUSE FACILITIES IN THE STATE;

33 (3) PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF END
 34 USE MARKETS FOR DREDGED MATERIAL; AND

35 (4) PROMOTE THE REUSE OF DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL AND
 36 MARKET THE RESULTING PRODUCTS.

1 (D) FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE PROGRAM MAY BE IN THE FORM OF 2 LOANS OR GRANTS, AS PROVIDED IN THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE 3 DEPARTMENT.

4 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 5 SUBTITLE.

6 (F) (1) THE PROGRAM IS CONTINGENT ON THE ALLOCATION TO THE
7 PROGRAM OF 5% OF THE MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET TO
8 THE MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF DREDGE
9 MATERIAL MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

10(2)THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL, IN11ACCORDANCE WITH THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET, ALLOCATE MONEY FROM THE12TRANSPORTATION TRUST FUND FOR THE PROGRAM AFTER ELEMENTS OF A13LONG-TERM PLAN FOR MANAGING DREDGED MATERIAL ARE OPERATIONAL AND14PROVIDE 20 YEARS OF PLACEMENT CAPACITY AS DEFINED IN §§ 5-1102(D)(2)(II) AND155-1104.2(D) OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE.

THE MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR
 TRANSPORTING DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL AND THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH
 TRANSPORTING DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL FOR PROCESSING AT THE SITE OF A
 DREDGE DREDGED MATERIAL REUSE FACILITY.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1,

22 2006, the Maryland Department of Transportation shall report to the Governor and,

23 subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on the

24 planned date of funding of the Dredged Material Disposal Alternatives Program.

25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That an individual or business

26 enterprise that receives financial assistance from the Dredge Dredged Material

27 Disposal Alternatives Program established by this Act for the development,

28 construction, or operation of a dredge dredged material reuse facility shall regularly

29 submit to the Department of Business and Economic Development a status report

30 that clearly documents how the moneys are being used by the individual or business 31 enterprise and the extent to which dredge dredged material has been processed and

32 reused.

33 SECTION 3. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of

34 Business and Economic Development may impose terms and conditions on financial

35 assistance provided from the Dredge Dredged Material Disposal Alternatives

36 Program established under this Act.

37 SECTION 4. <u>5.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 38 effect October 1, 2004.
