15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

1 (c) A person who violates this section after being convicted of a previous 2 violation of this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to:

3 (1) imprisonment not exceeding 25 years; or

4 (2) if the violation results in the death of the victim, imprisonment not 5 exceeding 30 years.

6 (d) (1) (i) A parent or other person who has permanent or temporary care 7 or custody or responsibility for the supervision of a minor may not cause abuse to the 8 minor.

9 (ii) A household member or family member may not cause abuse to 10 a minor.

11 (2) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person who 12 violates paragraph (1) of this subsection is guilty of the felony of child abuse in the 13 second degree and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 15 years.

14 (e) A sentence imposed under this section may be separate from and 15 consecutive to or concurrent with a sentence for any crime based on the act 16 establishing the violation of this section.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2004.
