1 AN ACT concerning

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3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Small Business Reserve Program; designating the types of procurements in which the Small Business Reserve Program may participate; requiring certain procurement units to achieve a certain percentage of small business procurement contracts under the Program; requiring the Department of General Services to establish certain procedures to assist small businesses; requiring certain procurement units to report to the Board of Public Works by a certain date; defining certain terms; and generally relating to small business procurement contracts. 11 BY adding to Article - State Finance and Procurement Section 14-501 through 14-505, inclusive, to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 5. Small Business Reserve Program" Annotated Code of Maryland (2001 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement) SECTION 1. - 26 (1) THE BUSINESS IS INDEPENDENTLY OWNED AND OPERATED;
- 27 (2) THE BUSINESS IS NOT A SUBSIDIARY OF ANOTHER BUSINESS;

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(3) THE BUSINESS IS NOT DOMINANT IN ITS FIELD OF OPERATION;

2 (4) THE WHOLESALE OPERATIONS OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT EMPLOY
3 MORE THAN 50 PERSONS, AND THE GROSS SALES OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT EXCEED
4 \$2,000,000 IN ITS MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED FISCAL YEAR;

5 (5) THE RETAIL OPERATIONS OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT EMPLOY MORE 6 THAN 25 PERSONS, AND THE GROSS SALES OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT EXCEED 7 \$1,000,000 IN ITS MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED FISCAL YEAR;

8 (6) THE MANUFACTURING OPERATIONS OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT 9 EMPLOY MORE THAN 100 PERSONS, AND THE GROSS SALES OF THE BUSINESS DID 10 NOT EXCEED \$1,000,000 IN ITS MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED FISCAL YEAR;

11(7)THE SERVICE OPERATIONS OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT EMPLOY12MORE THAN 100 PERSONS, AND THE GROSS SALES OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT13EXCEED \$1,000,000 IN ITS MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED FISCAL YEAR; AND

14 (8) THE CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT
15 EMPLOY MORE THAN 50 PERSONS, AND THE GROSS SALES OF THE BUSINESS DID NOT
16 EXCEED \$4,000,000 IN ITS MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED FISCAL YEAR.

17 (D) "SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE" MEANS THOSE PROCUREMENTS THAT ARE
18 LIMITED TO RESPONSES FROM SMALL BUSINESSES UNDER § 14-502(B) OF THIS
19 SUBTITLE.

21 (A) THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES TO ALL PROCUREMENTS BY A DESIGNATED 22 PROCUREMENT UNIT.

(B) A DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL STRUCTURE ITS
PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES TO ACHIEVE A MINIMUM OF 10 PERCENT OF THE
UNIT'S TOTAL DOLLAR VALUE OF GOODS, SUPPLIES, SERVICES, MAINTENANCE,
CONSTRUCTION, CONSTRUCTION-RELATED SERVICES, ARCHITECTURAL SERVICE,
AND ENGINEERING SERVICE CONTRACTS TO BE MADE DIRECTLY TO SMALL
BUSINESSES.

30 (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS
31 TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR COMPILING AND MAINTAINING A COMPREHENSIVE
32 BIDDER'S LIST OF QUALIFIED SMALL BUSINESSES THAT SHALL BE POSTED ON THE
33 DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.

34 (B) EACH DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL ENSURE COMPLIANCE
 35 WITH THE REGULATIONS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

2 (A) ANY PROCUREMENT BY A DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT OF GOODS,
3 SUPPLIES, SERVICES, MAINTENANCE, CONSTRUCTION, CONSTRUCTION-RELATED
4 SERVICES, ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES, AND ENGINEERING SERVICES SHALL BE
5 ELIGIBLE FOR DESIGNATION FOR THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE.

6 (B) A SOLICITATION FOR PROCUREMENT THAT HAS BEEN DESIGNATED FOR A
7 SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN THE SAME MANNER AS
8 REQUIRED FOR AN INVITATION FOR BIDS AS SET FORTH IN § 13-103(C) OF THIS
9 ARTICLE.

(C) THE PROCUREMENT OFFICER OF A DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT
 SHALL AWARD A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT DESIGNATED FOR A SMALL BUSINESS
 RESERVE TO THE SMALL BUSINESS THAT SUBMITS A RESPONSIVE BID THAT:

13 (1) IS THE LOWEST BID PRICE;

14 (2) IF THE INVITATION FOR BIDS SO PROVIDES, IS THE LOWEST 15 EVALUATED BID PRICE; OR

16 (3) IS THE BID OR PROPOSAL MOST FAVORABLE TO THE STATE WITHIN 17 THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE.

19 (A) WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR, EACH
20 DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE OPERATION
21 AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE PROGRAM TO THE BOARD
22 OF PUBLIC WORKS.

(B) WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER RECEIPT OF ALL REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER
SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL COMPILE
THE INFORMATION AND REPORT ON THE ENTIRE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE
PROGRAM TO THE LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE
STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 29 effect October 1, 2004.
