### Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System - Membership - Maryland Forest and Parks Service Managers

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing membership for certain law enforcement officers of

- 5 the Maryland Forest and Parks Service who are employed by the Department of
- 6 Natural Resources in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; and
- 7 generally relating to pensions for supervisory and managerial law enforcement
- 8 officers of the Maryland Forest and Parks Service who are employed by the
- 9 Department of Natural Resources.

#### 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
