- date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task
- Force on the Status of Women and Information Technology.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 6	(A) THERE IS A TASK FORCE ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.
7	(B) THE TASK FORCE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:
8 9	(1) ONE MEMBER FROM THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;
10 11	(2) ONE MEMBER FROM THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

24 25	(8) THE DIRECTOR FOR THE CENTER FOR WOMEN AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;
26 27	(9) ONE MEMBER FROM THE MARYLAND COMMISSION FOR WOMEN, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR; AND
28	(10) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:
29 30	(I) ONE BUSINESS ENTREPRENEUR WHO IS THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF AN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COMPANY;
31 32	(II) TWO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY BUSINESS PROFESSIONALS, AT LEAST ONE OF WHOM IS A WOMAN;
33 34	(III) ONE HUMAN RESOURCES REPRESENTATIVE FROM A MAJOR CORPORATION WHO HIRES INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY WORKERS;

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- 1 (IV) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY 2 THAT REPRESENTS TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION;
- 3 (V) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A COMMUNITY COLLEGE
- 4 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM;
- 5 (VI) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A 4-YEAR EDUCATIONAL
- 6 INSTITUTION INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM;
- 7 (VII) ONE SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHER; AND
- 8 (VIII) TWO COLLEGE STUDENTS MAJORING IN INFORMATION 9 TECHNOLOGY, PREFERABLY WOMEN.
- 10 (C) EACH MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE APPOINTED ON OR BEFORE 11 AUGUST 1, 2004.
- 12 (D) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, APPOINTMENTS TO THE TASK FORCE
- 13 SHALL BE MADE TO ENSURE REGIONAL, ECONOMIC, ETHNIC, AND GENDER
- 14 DIVERSITY ON THE TASK FORCE.
- 15 (E) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TASK FORCE.
- 16 (F) THE TASK FORCE SHALL ELECT A VICE CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG ITS 17 MEMBERS.
- 18 (G) THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TASK FORCE MAY:
- 19 (1) ESTABLISH COMMITTEES FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMPLETING THE 20 DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE; AND
- 21 (2) APPOINT INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE 22 TO SERVE ON EACH COMMITTEE.
- 23 (H) THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SHALL
- 24 PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT TO THE TASK FORCE.
- 25 (I) A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR
- 26 SERVING ON THE TASK FORCE, BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR
- 27 EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN
- 28 THE STATE BUDGET.
- 29 (J) THE TASK FORCE SHALL:
- 30 (1) STUDY THE ISSUES RELATING TO THE DECLINING INVOLVEMENT OF
- 31 GIRLS AND WOMEN IN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY;
- 32 (2) STUDY THE IMPACT THIS DECLINE HAS ON THE OVERALL
- 33 TECHNOLOGY LITERACY OF MARYLAND'S WORKFORCE;

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- 1 (3) STUDY THE IMPACT OF THIS DECLINE ON THE FUTURE OF THE 2 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY WORKFORCE IN MARYLAND;
- 3 (4) CREATE AWARENESS THROUGHOUT THE STATE ON THE ISSUE OF 4 WOMEN AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND THE FINDINGS OF THIS TASK FORCE;
- 5 (5) IDENTIFY AND EXAMINE EXISTING PROGRAMS AND SERVICES, LAWS,
- 6 AND REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO IDENTIFYING PRACTICES THAT BEST
- 7 ADDRESS THE ISSUE IN EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT;
- 8 (6) INVESTIGATE STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS THE CHALLENGES THAT
- 9 WILL BETTER MEET THE STATE'S WORKFORCE DEMANDS IN ALL CAREER AREAS
- 10 WHERE TECHNOLOGY IS USED;
- 11 (7) DEVELOP A STATEWIDE COMPREHENSIVE WOMEN AND
- 12 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PLAN AND STRATEGIES FOR PLAN IMPLEMENTATION
- 13 AND PUBLIC PROMOTION OF THE PLAN; AND
- 14 (8) FACILITATE COORDINATION AND COMMUNICATION AMONG STATE
- 15 AND LOCAL AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS REGARDING ACHIEVING THE GOALS OF
- 16 THE PLAN.
- 17 (K) THE TASK FORCE SHALL PRESENT AN ANNUAL REPORT ON ITS FINDINGS
- 18 AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246
- 19 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ON OR BEFORE
- 20 OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2004.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 July 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June
- 23 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 24 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
