2 Maryland Religious Independence From Federal Courts

3	FOR the	purpose	of req	uesting	the (Congress	of the	United	States to	pass	legislat	ion

- WHEREAS, The Declaration of Independence declared that governments are
- 19 instituted to secure certain inalienable rights, including life, liberty, and the pursuit
- 20 of happiness, with which all human beings are endowed by their Creator and to which
- 21 they are entitled by the laws of nature and of nature's God; and
- WHEREAS, The First Amendment to the United States Constitution secures
- 23 rights against laws respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting the free
- 24 exercise thereof made by the federal government; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The rights secured under the First Amendment to the United
- 26 States Constitution have been interpreted by the courts of the United States to be
- 27 included among the provisions of the Fourteenth Amendment; and
- WHEREAS, The Tenth Amendment to the United States Constitution clearly
- 29 recognizes that a state retains all rights not granted to the federal government of the
- 30 United States of America; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Maryland Charter of 1632, the Preamble to the Maryland
- 2 Constitution, and Articles 36 and 37 of the Maryland Declaration of Rights recognize
- 3 God as the source of the blessings of liberty; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The federal courts have claimed legal jurisdiction in matters
- 5 pertaining to religion within an individual state; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States
- 7 Constitution grants the Congress power to enforce the provisions of the Fourteenth
- 8 Amendment; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Article III, Section 2, of the United States Constitution grants the
- 10 Congress the authority to except certain matters from the jurisdiction of the federal
- 11 courts inferior to the United States Supreme Court; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Disputes and doubts have arisen with respect to public displays of
- 13 the Ten Commandments and to other public expressions of religious faith; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Legislation has been introduced in Congress to except subject
- 15 matter jurisdiction from the federal courts in certain matters pertaining to the power
- 16 to make a public expression of religious faith; now, therefore, be it
- 17 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Maryland
- 18 declares its independence from federal court interference with religion within the
- 19 State of Maryland; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly requests the Congress of the United
- 21 States to pass legislation declaring that the power: (1) to display the Ten
- 22 Commandments, (2) to recite the Pledge of Allegiance, and (3) to recite the national
- 23 motto on or within property owned or administered by the several states or political
- 24 subdivisions thereof be among the powers reserved to the states respectively; that the
- 25 words to the Pledge of Allegiance are "I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United
- 26 States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God,
- 27 indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all."; that the words of the national motto are
- 28 "In God We Trust"; and requesting the Congress of the United States to pass
- 29 legislation making the subject matter of these declarations exceptions to the subject
- 30 matter jurisdiction of federal courts inferior to the United States Supreme Court; and
- 31 be it further
- 32 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 33 Legislative Services to the Honorable Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr., Governor of Maryland;
- 34 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
