1 Section 3

2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Education

5 6-112.

6 (a) There is a program of State and local aid to teachers who pursue
7 certification by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards known as the
8 State and Local Aid Program for Certification by the National Board for Professional
9 Teaching Standards.

10 (b) Each school year, the State Board shall select, consistent with the amount 11 provided in the State budget for the Program, a maximum of 500 teachers to 12 participate in the Program.

13 (c) The State Board shall adopt regulations to implement and administer the14 Program established under this section, including:

15 (1) Procedures for submitting applications for aid; and

16 (2) Criteria for the selection of recipients of aid.

17 (d) (1) Each teacher selected by the State Board to receive aid shall receive
18 from the State an amount equal to the certification fee charged by the National Board
19 for Professional Teaching Standards.

20 (2) Each county shall pay to the State one-third of the cost of 21 certification for each teacher who participates in the Program who teaches in the 22 county.

(3) (i) A teacher who does not complete all the requirements for
assessment by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards shall
reimburse the State the full amount of the aid received to participate in the Program.

(ii) The State shall reimburse the county the amount received
under paragraph (2) of this subsection on receipt of the reimbursement of aid from a
teacher under this paragraph.

29 (iii) The provisions of subparagraph (i) of this paragraph do not
30 apply to a teacher who completes all the requirements for assessment by the National
31 Board for Professional Teaching Standards but who does not receive certification.

(e) The State Board shall establish a statewide staff development plan that
utilizes the skills and knowledge of teachers who have obtained National Board
certification.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

4 on June 1, 1997. [It shall remain effective for a period of 7 <u>11</u> years, and, at the end

5 of May 31, 2004 2008, and with no further action required by the General Assembly,

6 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency

8 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,

9 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members

10 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from

11 the date it is enacted.
