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## Department of Natural Resources - Vessel Operation - Regulations

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to adopt

- 4 regulations relating to the operation of vessels so that each vessel of a type or
- 5 size may be operated with equal freedom or under similar circumstances as
- 6 other vessels of that type or size; and generally relating to the adoption of
- 7 regulations relating to the operation of vessels.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

# **Article - Natural Resources**

16 8-704.

17 (a) The Department may adopt regulations necessary to carry out the 18 provisions of this subtitle.

19 (b) In order to protect the public safety, welfare, and recreational interests in 20 waters of the State, the Department may adopt a program relating to the placement

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<ol> <li>of buoys, mooring buoys, and other apparatus used to secure, berth, or moor vessels in</li> <li>the waters of the State. The Department shall consult with any county affected by the</li> <li>program.</li> </ol>

The numbering system used shall conform to the one adopted by the 10 federal government. 25 (b-2) (1) The Department shall adopt regulations prohibiting the operation of 26 personal watercraft above idle speed in any area of water with a depth of less than 18 27 inches.		
28 (2) Except as provided in paragraph (1) of this subsection, the 29 Department may adopt regulations limiting the use of personal watercraft in any 30 area of water with a depth of less than 1 meter.		
31 (c) Department regulations do not become effective unless advertised publicly 32 in at least 2 daily newspapers of general circulation and at least 1 weekly newspaper 33 serving the area or areas involved at least 45 days before the effective date. If 50 34 citizens of the State file a petition with the Department at least 15 days prior to the		

34 citizens of the State file a petition with the Department at least 15 days prior to the 35 effective date, the Department shall conduct a public hearing on the proposed 36 regulations.

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1 (d) A municipality or other local authority may not establish any regulation of 2 a local nature which does not conform with the Department's regulations.

3 (e) On any proposed regulation affecting the equipment or operation of any

4 vessel subject to this subtitle, the Secretary shall solicit the advice and opinions of

5 officials of representative boating associations, yacht clubs, and local, State, or federal

6 governments or officials, having knowledge or experience with the subject matter of 7 the proposed regulations. These representatives and officials serve as an advisory

8 committee appointed by the Secretary to review the proposed regulations.

9 (f) The Department, with the endorsement of the Secretary of Natural 10 Resources and the Secretary of the Environment, after a public hearing following 60 11 days' notice, shall adopt and publish sound level limits governing the noise generated 12 by the operation of pleasure craft on the waters of the State. The sound level limits 13 shall be established at the most restrictive level consistent with the environmental 14 noise standards adopted by the Department of the Environment which is achievable 15 through the application of the best available technology and at a reasonable cost. The 16 Department shall adopt regulations for the administration and enforcement of the 17 sound level limits, taking into account accepted scientific and professional methods 18 for measurement of sound levels.

19 (g) The Department shall adopt regulations to prohibit a person from:

20 (1) Operating an unauthorized vessel over a power boat race course; or

21 (2) Swimming across a boundary of a power boat race course.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 23 effect October 1, 2004.

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
