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<sup>35 (</sup>c) (1) If a retiree receives a State disability retirement allowance or has 16
36 or more years of creditable service, the retiree or the retiree's surviving spouse or
37 dependent child is entitled to the same State subsidy allowed a State employee.

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1 (2) In all other cases, if a retiree has at least 5 years of creditable service,

2 the retiree or the retiree's surviving spouse or dependent child is entitled to 1/16 of

3 the State subsidy allowed a State employee for each year of the retiree's creditable

4 service up to 16 years.

5 (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (2) of this subsection and subsection

6 (a)(4)(i) of this section, if a retiree is an additional employee or agent of the State

7 Racing Commission, for the purposes of determining a retiree's State subsidy,

8 creditable service shall be determined with respect to service as an additional

9 employee or agent beginning from the initial date of employment or January 1, 1986, 10 whichever is later.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 12 effect October 1, 2004.

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
