A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment - Water Quality - Penalties**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain criminal penalties for knowingly making certain
4 false statements or falsifying certain devices in violation of certain water quality
5 laws.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
7 Article - Environment
8 Section 9-343
9 Annotated Code of Maryland
10 (1996 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article - Environment**

14 9-343.

15 (a) (1) A person who violates any provision of or fails to perform any duty
16 imposed by this subtitle, or who violates any provision of or fails to perform any duty
17 imposed by a rule, regulation, order, or permit adopted or issued under this subtitle,
18 is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to:

19 (i) For a first offense, a fine not exceeding \$25,000 or
20 imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both; or

21 (ii) If the conviction is for a violation committed after a first
22 conviction of the person under this subsection, a fine not exceeding \$50,000 for each
23 day of violation or imprisonment not exceeding 2 years or both.

24 (2) In addition to any criminal penalties imposed on a person convicted
25 under this subsection, the person may be enjoined from continuing the violation.

1 (3) Each day on which a violation occurs is a separate violation under
2 this subsection.

3 (b) A person is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine
4 not exceeding [\$10,000] \$50,000 or imprisonment not exceeding [6 months] 2 YEARS
5 or both if the person:

6 (1) Knowingly makes any false statement, representation, or
7 certification in any application, record, report, plan, or other document filed or
8 required to be maintained under this subtitle or any rule, regulation, order, or permit
9 adopted or issued under this subtitle; or

10 (2) Falsifies, tampers with, or knowingly renders inaccurate any
11 monitoring device or method required to be maintained under this subtitle or any
12 rule, regulation, order, or permit adopted or issued under this subtitle.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 October 1, 2004.
