- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Transportation** 2 16-101. 3 (a) An individual may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any 4 highway in this State unless: 5 (1) The individual holds a driver's license issued under this title; The individual is expressly exempt from the licensing requirements 6 (2) 7 of this title; or The individual otherwise is specifically authorized by this title to 9 drive vehicles of the class that the individual is driving or attempting to drive. 10 27-101. 11 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the 12 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation: 13 Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any (1) 14 other law of this State: or 15 Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the 16 Maryland Vehicle Law. Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 17 18 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 19 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
