AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the State should set a goal of 90% of the funding guidelines to be continued beyond 2013 in order to maintain the level of investment needed for quality and to hold spending below the average of comparable universities to encourage efficiency.
