### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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# Task Force to Study the Dynamics of Elderly and Retiree Migration into and out of Maryland

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the Dynamics of Elderly and

- 5 Retiree Migration into and out of Maryland; establishing the membership of the
- 6 Task Force; requiring the Governor to attempt to ensure regional, ethnic,
- 7 economic, and gender diversity on the Task Force; providing staff support for the
- 8 Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain
- 9 compensation; authorizing a member of the Task Force to be reimbursed for
- 10 certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to oversee and assist in preparing a
- 11 certain study; requiring the study of the Task Force to contain a certain review,
- 12 a certain assessment, and certain examinations; requiring the members of the
- 13 Task Force to be appointed by a certain date; requiring the Task Force to issue
- 14 a report of the study's findings and recommendations by a certain date;
- 15 providing for the termination of the Task Force; and generally relating to the
- 16 Task Force to Study the Dynamics of Elderly and Retiree Migration into and out
- 17 of Maryland.

## 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF19 MARYLAND, That:

20 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Dynamics of Elderly and Retiree 21 Migration into and out of Maryland.

22 (b) The Task Force shall be composed of 16 members as follows:

3 (2)The study shall: 4 review the dynamics of elderly and retiree migration into and (i) 5 out of the State; assess the impact, if any, that the tax policies and benefits of (ii) 6 7 the State and other states have on elderly and retiree migration including: a comparison of the total tax burden in the State on the 8 1. elderly and retirees as compared to other states; and 9 10 2. a comparison of the total tax burden in the State on the 11 elderly and retirees as a percentage of personal income as compared to other states; 12 examine the benefits that the elderly and retirees provide to the (iii) 13 local community and the State by participating in mentoring or volunteer programs 14 or similar community activities; and 15 examine State expenditures on the elderly and retirees (iv) 16 including health care expenditures. The Task Force shall: 17 (g) 18 (1)be appointed and organize and begin its deliberations no later than 19 July 1, 2004; and

20 (2) submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor 21 and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General 22 Assembly before December 31, 2004.

23 (h) The Task Force shall terminate on December 31, 2004.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25 June 1, 2004.

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
