18 19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:	
20 21	(a) There is a Task Force to Study the Dynamics of Elderly and Retiree Migration into and out of Maryland.	
22	(b) The Task Force shall be composed of 16 17 members as follows:	
23 24	(1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;	

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1 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 2 the House; 3 (3) the Secretary of Aging, or the Secretary's designee; (4) the Secretary of Business and Economic Development, or the 5 Secretary's designee; (5) the Secretary of Planning, or the Secretary's designee; 6 7 the Executive Director of the Rural Maryland Council, or the (6)8 Executive Director's designee; 9 (7) one representative from the Maryland Association of Counties, appointed by the Governor; 11 one representative from a Maryland chapter of the National 12 Association of Retired Federal Employees, appointed by the Governor; 13 one representative of AARP, formerly known as the American 14 Association of Retired Persons, appointed by the Governor; 15 one representative of the Maryland Gerontological Association, (10)appointed by the Governor; 17 (11)one representative of the health care industry with expertise in 18 senior health issues, appointed by the Governor; 19 one representative of the housing industry with expertise in senior (12)20 housing and retirement community issues, appointed by the Governor; 21 one representative of the Center on Aging, University of Maryland (13)22 College Park, appointed by the Governor; one representative of the Maryland Institute for Policy Analysis and 23 24 Research, University of Maryland Baltimore County, appointed by the Governor; 25 (15)one representative of Loyola College in Maryland, appointed by the 26 Governor; and 27 one representative of the Regional Economic Studies Institute, (16)28 Towson University, appointed by the Governor; and one representative of the United Seniors of Maryland, appointed by 29 (17)30 the Governor. To the extent practicable, the Governor shall attempt to ensure regional, 31 (c) ethnic, economic, and gender diversity on the Task Force. 33 (d) The University System of Maryland shall provide staff support to the Task 34 Force.

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1	(e) A member of the Task Force may not receive compensation for serving on
2	the Task Force, but is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
6	(f) (1) The Task Force shall oversee and assist in preparing a comprehensive and objective study to be conducted by the Maryland Institute for Governmental Service, the Maryland Institute for Policy Analysis and Research, Loyola College in Maryland, and the Regional Economic Studies Institute.
8	(2) The study shall:
9 10	(i) review the dynamics of elderly and retiree migration into and out of the State;
11 12	(ii) assess the impact, if any, that the tax policies and benefits of the State and other states have on elderly and retiree migration including:
13 14	1. a comparison of the total tax burden in the State on the elderly and retirees as compared to other states; and
15 16	2. a comparison of the total tax burden in the State on the elderly and retirees as a percentage of personal income as compared to other states;
	(iii) examine the benefits that the elderly and retirees provide to the local community and the State by participating in mentoring or volunteer programs or similar community activities; and
20 21	(iv) examine State <u>and county</u> expenditures on the elderly and retirees including health care expenditures.
22	(g) The Task Force shall:
23 24	(1) be appointed and organize and begin its deliberations no later than July 1, 2004; and
	(2) submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly before December 31, 2004.
28	(h) The Task Force shall terminate on December 31, 2004.
29 30	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2004.
