## 2 Legislative Districting - Resident Delegates by County

- 3 FOR the purpose of amending the Maryland Constitution to provide that legislative
- 4 districting shall, to the greatest extent practicable, result in a resident delegate
- 5 from every county; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the
- 6 State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.
- 7 BY proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution
- 8 Article III Legislative Department
- 9 Section 4
- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 11 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses
- 12 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

## 13 Article III - Legislative Department

14 4.

- Each legislative district shall consist of adjoining territory, be compact in form,
- 16 and of substantially equal population. Due regard shall be given to natural
- 17 boundaries and the boundaries of political subdivisions AND, TO THE GREATEST
- 18 EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THAT EVERY COUNTY HAS A RESIDENT DELEGATE.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly
- 20 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act
- 21 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the
- 22 Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do
- 23 not apply.
- 24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section
- 25 proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the
- 26 legal and qualified voters of this State at the next general election to be held in
- 27 November, 2004 for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of directions contained in
- 28 Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this
- 29 proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot

- 1 there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against 2 the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the 3 election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the

- 4 proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and 5 further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
