BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 18 **Article - Transportation** 19 16-402.2. THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL MAINTAIN A SAFE DRIVING CREDIT SYSTEM 20 (A) 21 FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL ISSUED A DRIVER'S LICENSE UNDER THIS TITLE.

- 8 (C) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT MAINTAIN A BALANCE OF MORE THAN FIVE 9 SAFE DRIVING CREDITS.
- 10 (D) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL:
- 11 (1) USE AN INDIVIDUAL'S ACCUMULATED SAFE DRIVING CREDITS TO
- 12 OFFSET AN EQUIVALENT NUMBER OF POINTS ASSESSED AGAINST THE INDIVIDUAL
- 13 AFTER EACH CONVICTION OF THE INDIVIDUAL FOR A MOVING VIOLATION FOR
- 14 WHICH NOT MORE THAN TWO POINTS MAY BE ASSESSED UNDER § 16-402 OF THIS
- 15 SUBTITLE; AND
- 16 (2) APPLY THE SAFE DRIVING CREDITS TO THE CHRONOLOGICALLY 17 EARLIEST CONVICTION FOR WHICH POINTS HAVE BEEN ASSESSED AND ARE VALID.
- 18 (E) A SAFE DRIVING CREDIT AWARDED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE
- 19 INVALIDATED IF THE ADMINISTRATION RECEIVES A NOTICE OF CONVICTION OR A
- 20 NOTICE OF PROBATION BEFORE JUDGMENT DISPOSITION FOR A VIOLATION OF §
- 21 2-209, TITLE 2, SUBTITLE 5, OR § 3-211 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, § 21-902 OF
- 22 THIS ARTICLE, OR ANY VEHICLE LAW OR REGULATION OF THIS STATE OR OF ANY
- 23 LOCAL AUTHORITY THAT OCCURRED DURING THE PERIOD FOR WHICH THE SAFE
- 24 DRIVING CREDIT WAS AWARDED.
