- 8 bid procurement to the lowest responsive bid price or evaluated bid price;
- 9 requiring a statement of evaluation factors in certain requests for sealed
- 10 proposals to include the high performance buildings price preference requiring a
- 11 <u>unit of State government requesting an appropriation for the preliminary</u>
- 12 planning of a proposed capital project to include in its program submission to
- 13 the Department of Budget and Management a justification for proposing that
- 14 <u>the building should be designed as a high performance building; defining a</u>
- 15 certain term; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to price
- 16 preferences for high performance buildings in the award of certain public
