3 FOR the purpose of increasing the distance beyond the statutory width limitation for

4 a Class M motor home or travel trailer that safety devices and retracted

5 awnings may extend when operated on interstate, State primary, or certain

6 other highways; increasing the length limitation of a Class M motor home

7 operated on interstate, State primary, or certain other highways; increasing the

8 statutory length limitation of a combination of noncommercial vehicles

9 consisting of a power unit and a travel trailer; clarifying language; and generally

10 relating to the widths and lengths of vehicles and loads.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
