4 FOR the purpose of providing that a waiver of certain personal injury protection

- benefits made by a person that is insured continuously by the insurer is effective 5
- until the waiver is withdrawn in writing; and generally relating to the waiver of 6
- personal injury protection benefits in connection with a motor vehicle liability 7

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Insurance 16

17 19-506.

18 If the first named insured does not wish to obtain the benefits (a) (1)19 described in § 19-505 of this subtitle, the first named insured shall make an

20 affirmative written waiver of those benefits.
