21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF



26 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "COMMISSION" MEANS THE COMMISSION FOR THE

27 BLIND.



- 1 (II)PREFERENCE SHALL BE GIVEN TO BLIND INDIVIDUALS. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL: 2 (2) 3 (I) SERVE AS THE SECRETARY TO THE COMMISSION: AND (II)BE THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF THE 5 COMMISSION. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE 6 (3) 7 COMMISSION. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR IS ENTITLED TO THE COMPENSATION 9 PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 10 (5) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MAY EMPLOY A STAFF AS NEEDED, IN 11 ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET.
- 12 (G) THE COMMISSION SHALL:

- 33 (7) PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF
- 34 EDUCATION AND LOCAL EDUCATION SYSTEMS IN PROVIDING AUXILIARY AIDS AND
- 35 SERVICES TO BLIND STUDENTS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE INDIVIDUALS

(8) PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO AGENCIES IN THE STATE TO 2 ENSURE THAT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PURCHASED OR USED BY THOSE 3 AGENCIES IS ACCESSIBLE TO BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED INDIVIDUALS; CONDUCT REVIEWS OF CONSUMER SATISFACTION WITH 5 COMMISSION PROGRAMS AND PERFORM OTHER FUNCTIONS OF THE STATEWIDE 6 REHABILITATION COUNCIL; APPLY FOR AND RECEIVE MONEY FROM ANY GOVERNMENTAL UNIT (10)8 TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAMS OF THE COMMISSION AND RECEIVE ON BEHALF OF THE 9 STATE ANY GIFTS, DONATIONS, OR BEQUESTS FROM ANY SOURCE FOR USE IN 10 CARRYING OUT THE COMMISSION'S DUTIES; 11 (11)DEVELOP AND ADMINISTER PROGRAMS THAT WILL AID IN 12 PROVIDING SERVICES TO BLIND INDIVIDUALS AND ARE DETERMINED BY THE 13 COMMISSION TO FALL WITHIN ITS SCOPE OF AUTHORITY: AND 14 (12)ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT PROGRAMS OF THE 15 COMMISSION. THE COMMISSION SHALL PUBLISH AN ANNUAL REPORT, INCLUDING 16 (H) (1) 17 A LIST OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS, FINDINGS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 18 IMPROVEMENT BASED ON THE COMMISSION'S PERFORMANCE DURING THE YEAR. 19 THE REPORT SHALL CONTAIN INFORMATION NEEDED TO EVALUATE (2) 20 THE PROGRESS OF THE COMMISSION IN MEETING THE NEEDS OF BLIND 21 INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE. 22 ANY APPLICANT FOR OR RECIPIENT OF SERVICES FROM THE (I) (1) 23 COMMISSION WHO IS DISSATISFIED WITH ANY ACTION TAKEN OR DECISION MADE 24 REGARDING THOSE SERVICES MAY FILE A COMPLAINT SETTING FORTH THE BASIS 25 FOR THE DISSATISFACTION AND THE REMEDY SOUGHT.
