- 1 (b) If a school vehicle has stopped on a roadway and is operating the
- 2 alternately flashing red lights specified in § 22-228 of this article, the driver of any
- 3 other vehicle meeting or overtaking the school vehicle may not proceed until the
- 4 school vehicle resumes motion or the alternately flashing red lights are deactivated.
- 5 (c) This section does not apply to the driver of a vehicle on a divided highway,
- 6 if the school vehicle is on a different roadway.

- 8 (g) Any person who is convicted of a violation of any of the [provisions of §
- 9 13-704 of this article or § 21-901.1(a) of this article ("Reckless driving")] FOLLOWING

- 11 (1) § 13-704 ("FRAUD IN APPLICATION");
