## Vehicle Laws - Standing or Parking Near Crosswalks - Baltimore City

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing Baltimore City to regulate the distance from crosswalks at intersections in Baltimore City within which a person may not stand or park a vehicle; requiring Baltimore City to post certain signs under certain circumstances at a crosswalk where the standing or parking of a vehicle is regulated under this Act; prohibiting a person from standing or parking a vehicle within a certain distance of certain crosswalks at intersections as specified on a sign placed under this Act; and generally relating to regulation of the standing or parking of vehicles near crosswalks in Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

(e) A person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle on a crosswalk.
(n) (1) [A] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A person may not stand or park a vehicle within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.
(2) (I) THE GOVERNING BODY OF BALTIMORE CITY MAY REGULATE THE DISTANCE FROM A CROSSWALK AT AN INTERSECTION IN BALTIMORE CITY WITHIN WHICH A PERSON MAY NOT STAND OR PARK A VEHICLE.
(II) TO IMPLEMENT ITS AUTHORITY UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH, THE GOVERNING BODY OF BALTIMORE CITY SHALL POST OFFICIAL SIGNS AT APPROPRIATE VISIBLE LOCATIONS AT ANY CROSSWALK WHERE THE AREA WITHIN WHICH A PERSON IS PROHIBITED FROM STANDING OR PARKING A VEHICLE VARIES FROM THE DISTANCE SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
(III) THE SIGNS SHALL GIVE NOTICE OF THE DISTANCE FROM A CROSSWALK AT AN INTERSECTION WITHIN WHICH A PERSON MAY NOT STAND OR PARK A VEHICLE.
(IV) A PERSON MAY NOT STAND OR PARK A VEHICLE WITHIN THE DISTANCE FROM A CROSSWALK SPECIFIED ON A SIGN PLACED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (III) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.
(V) NOTHING IN THIS PARAGRAPH AFFECTS THE APPLICATION IN BALTIMORE CITY OF SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION.

The Charter of Baltimore City
Article II - General Powers
The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said Constitution and Public General Laws:
