| | SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: |

| 1 | 17 (a) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "FIREARM" MEANS: |
| 1 | (I) A WEAPON THAT EXPELS, IS DESIGNED TO EXPEL, OR MAY READILY BE CONVERTED TO EXPEL A PROJECTILE BY THE ACTION OF AN EXPLOSIVE; OR |
| 2 | (II) THE FRAME OR RECEIVER OF SUCH A WEAPON. |
| 2 | 22 (2) "FIREARM" INCLUDES AN ANTIQUE FIREARM, HANDGUN, RIFLE, 23 SHOTGUN, SHORT-BARRELED RIFLE, SHORT-BARRELED SHOTGUN, STARTER GUN, 24 OR ANY OTHER FIREARM, WHETHER LOADED OR UNLOADED. |
| - | (B) A person may not use [an antique firearm capable of being concealed on the person or any handgun] A FIREARM in the commission of a crime of violence, as |

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defined in § 5-101 of the Public Safety Article, or any felony, whether the [antique
 firearm or handgun] FIREARM is operable or inoperable at the time of the crime.

3 [(b)] (C) (1) (i) A person who violates this section is guilty of a 4 misdemeanor and, in addition to any other penalty imposed for the crime of violence 5 or felony, shall be sentenced to imprisonment for not less than 5 years and not 6 exceeding 20 years.

7 (ii) The court may not impose less than the minimum sentence of 5
8 years and, except as otherwise provided in § 4-305 of the Correctional Services
9 Article, the person is not eligible for parole in less than 5 years.

10 (2) For each subsequent violation, the sentence shall be consecutive to 11 and not concurrent with any other sentence imposed for the crime of violence or 12 felony.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 14 effect October 1, 2004.

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
