- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23
- 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 2 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 3 INDICATED.
- 4 (2) "ASSISTANCE PROGRAM" INCLUDES THE PROGRAM, THE MARYLAND
- 5 CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM DEVELOPED UNDER § 15-301 OF THIS TITLE, THE
- 6 MARYLAND PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM DEVELOPED UNDER § 15-124 OF THIS
- 7 SUBTITLE, AND THE MARYLAND PHARMACY DISCOUNT PROGRAM DEVELOPED
- 8 UNDER § 15-124.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 9 "PROPOSED BENEFICIARY" MEANS:
- 10 (I) AN INDIVIDUAL APPLYING FOR AN INDIVIDUAL'S OWN
- 11 BENEFITS FROM AN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, INCLUDING CHILDREN AND OTHER
- 12 DEPENDENTS OF THE APPLICANT; OR
- 13 (II) AN INDIVIDUAL ON WHOSE BEHALF AN APPLICATION FOR AN
- 14 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IS FILED. INCLUDING CHILDREN AND OTHER DEPENDENTS
- 15 OF THE INDIVIDUAL ON WHOSE BEHALF THE APPLICATION IS FILED.
- 16 (B) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE
- 17 DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE AN INDIVIDUAL APPLYING FOR AN ASSISTANCE
- 18 PROGRAM TO IDENTIFY ON THE APPLICATION THE EMPLOYER OF THE PROPOSED
- 19 BENEFICIARY.
- 20 (2) IF THE PROPOSED BENEFICIARY IS NOT EMPLOYED, THE APPLICANT
- 21 SHALL IDENTIFY ON THE APPLICATION THE EMPLOYER OF ANY ADULT WHO IS
- 22 RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING ANY FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO THE PROPOSED
- 23 BENEFICIARY.
- 24 (C) (1) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 25 REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE
- 26 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE EMPLOYERS IDENTIFIED UNDER SUBSECTION (B)
- 27 OF THIS SECTION, THE LOCATION OF THE EMPLOYERS, AND THE NUMBER OF
- 28 EMPLOYEES OF THE IDENTIFIED EMPLOYERS WHO ARE ENROLLED IN AN
- 29 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
- 30 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC THE
- 31 INFORMATION REQUIRED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER
- 32 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 33 (3) THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
- 34 SUBSECTION AND THE INFORMATION MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC UNDER
- 35 PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT CONTAIN PERSONAL IDENTIFYING
- 36 INFORMATION ON THE PROPOSED BENEFICIARIES.
- 37 (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS IMPLEMENTING THE
- 38 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2004.
