A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Procurement - Contracts for Services Rendered Outside the United States -Prohibitions

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a procurement unit from awarding a contract for

- 5 services to be rendered by certain persons from a site that is located outside of
- 6 the United States; requiring a certain contractor or subcontractor to certify that
- 7 certain services will be performed in the United States; requiring a contractor or
- 8 subcontractor to pay certain damages to a certain procurement unit under
- 9 certain circumstances; requiring a unit to terminate a certain contract under
- 10 certain circumstances; authorizing a procurement unit to bring a certain civil
- 11 action in a certain court under certain circumstances; requiring a certain court
- 12 to award reasonable attorney's fees and costs under certain circumstances;
- 13 providing that a provision that authorizes the Board of Public Works to modify
- 14 or waive certain requirements for certain procurement contracts that are to be
- 15 performed outside the United States or certain leases of real property outside
- 16 the State does not apply to certain contracts for services; establishing that
- 17 certain provisions of law apply to certain procurement; and generally relating to
- 18 procurement for services to be rendered by persons from a site that is located
- 19 outside the United States.

15 PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE SERVICES FOR THE STATE SHALL CERTIFY THAT THE 16 SERVICES WILL BE PERFORMED IN THE UNITED STATES.

IF, DURING THE LIFE OF THE CONTRACT, THE CONTRACTOR OR 17 (C) 18 SUBCONTRACTOR SHIFTS WORK OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES:

19 THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR SHALL PAY DAMAGES TO (1) 20 THE UNIT IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE AMOUNT PAID BY THE UNIT FOR THE 21 PERCENTAGE OF WORK PERFORMED OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES; AND

22 THE UNIT SHALL TERMINATE THE CONTRACT FOR (2)23 NONCOMPLIANCE.

24 (D) THE UNIT MAY BRING A CIVIL ACTION IN STATE OR FEDERAL COURT (1)25 TO COMPEL ENFORCEMENT UNDER THIS SECTION.

THE COURT SHALL AWARD REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES AND 26 (2)27 COSTS TO THE UNIT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 28 29 effect October 1, 2004.
