31 (B) THE BOARD SHALL SET REASONABLE FEES FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF 32 AN INFLUENZA VACCINATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS 33 SECTION THAT ACCOUNT FOR THE COST OF THE VACCINATION AND A REASONABLE 34 CHARGE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE VACCINATION.							

- 1 (C) THE BOARD, TOGETHER WITH THE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS AND THE
- 2 BOARD OF NURSING, SHALL JOINTLY DEVELOP AND ADOPT REGULATIONS TO
- 3 PROVIDE FOR PATIENT SAFETY AND TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
- 4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of
- 5 Pharmacy, in consultation with the State Board of Physicians and the State Board of
- 6 Nursing, shall adopt regulations necessary to implement this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall
- 8 take effect on the taking effect of the termination provision specified in Section 5 of
- 9 Chapter 249 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2002. If that termination provision
- 10 takes effect, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 11 This Act may not be interpreted to have any effect on that termination provision.
- 12 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions
- 13 of Section 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2004.
