CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Employees - Military Administrative Leave - Sunset Extension**

3 FOR the purpose of extending the termination date for the use of military  
4 administrative leave or certain paid leave for certain State employees who are  
5 on active military duty on a certain date or are activated for military duty on or  
6 after a certain date; and generally relating to military administrative leave for  
7 State employees.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

2 9-1107.

3 (a) This section applies to all employees, except temporary employees, of all  
4 units in the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Branches of State government,  
5 including any unit with an independent personnel system.

6 (b) Military administrative leave may be provided to an employee subject to  
7 this section who:

8 (1) is on active military duty on July 1, 2003; or

9 (2) is activated for military duty on or after July 1, 2003.

10 (c) (1) An employee who is eligible to receive military administrative leave  
11 under this section is entitled to leave in an amount sufficient to compensate the  
12 employee, during each pay period for which the employee is eligible to receive military  
13 administrative leave under this section, for the difference between the employee's  
14 active duty base salary paid by the federal government and the employee's State base  
15 salary or direct wages.

16 (2) Compensation provided under this subsection may not exceed an  
17 employee's State base salary or direct wages.

18 (d) An employee eligible to receive military administrative leave under this  
19 section who is activated for military duty on or after July 1, 2003, shall elect to use  
20 either military administrative leave or paid leave as provided in § 9-1104(3) of this  
21 subtitle.

22 (e) The Department shall keep a record of the use of military administrative  
23 leave under this section.

**Chapter 389 of the Acts of 2003**

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act shall take effect  
26 July 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of [1 year] 2 YEARS and, at the end  
27 of [June 30, 2004,] JUNE 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General  
28 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
30 June 1, 2004.
