2 (a) On the immediate approach of an emergency vehicle using audible and 3 visual signals that meet the requirements of § 22-218 of this article or of a police 4 vehicle lawfully using an audible signal, the driver of every other vehicle, unless 5 otherwise directed by a police officer, shall yield the right-of-way.

6 (b) On the immediate approach of an emergency vehicle using audible and 7 visual signals that meet the requirements of § 22-218 of this article or of a police 8 vehicle lawfully using an audible signal, the driver of every other vehicle, unless 9 otherwise directed by a police officer, shall drive immediately to a position parallel to 10 and as close as possible to the edge or curb of the roadway, clear of any intersection.

(c) On the immediate approach of an emergency vehicle using audible and
visual signals that meet the requirements of § 22-218 of this article or of a police
vehicle lawfully using an audible signal, the driver of every other vehicle, unless
otherwise directed by a police officer, shall stop and stay in this position until the
emergency vehicle has passed.

(d) A driver, when proceeding in the same direction as an emergency or police
vehicle, may not pass an emergency vehicle using audible and visual signals that
meet the requirements of § 22-218 of this article or a police vehicle lawfully using an
audible signal unless:

20 (1) The emergency vehicle has stopped; or

21 (2) Otherwise directed by a police officer.

(e) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE DIRECTED BY A POLICE OFFICER, WHEN AN
EMERGENCY VEHICLE USING ANY VISUAL SIGNAL IS STOPPED, STANDING, OR
PARKED ON A HIGHWAY, THE DRIVER OF A VEHICLE APPROACHING THE EMERGENCY
VEHICLE FROM THE REAR, AS SOON AS IT IS SAFE, SHALL:

(1) IF THE VEHICLE IS TRAVELING ON A HIGHWAY WITH TWO OR MORE
LANES OF TRAFFIC MOVING IN THE DIRECTION THAT THE EMERGENCY VEHICLE IS
FACING:

29 (I) VACATE THE LANE CLOSEST TO THE EMERGENCY VEHICLE; OR

30(II)IF UNABLE TO VACATE THE CLOSEST LANE, SLOW TO A SPEED31THAT IS 20 MILES PER HOUR LESS THAN THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT; OR

(2) IF THE VEHICLE IS TRAVELING ON A HIGHWAY WITH ONLY ONE
LANE OF TRAFFIC MOVING IN THE DIRECTION THAT THE EMERGENCY VEHICLE IS
FACING AND THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT IS 35 MILES PER HOUR OR GREATER, SLOW TO
A SPEED THAT IS 20 MILES PER HOUR LESS THAN THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT.

36 (F) This section does not relieve the driver of an emergency vehicle from the 37 duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Motor Vehicle
- 2 Administration and the Department of State Police shall conduct a public education
- 3 and awareness program to inform the public of the requirements of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2004.
