# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Education - Required Number of School Days - State of Emergency					
FOR the purpose of specifying that a day on which schools are closed during a state of emergency shall be credited against the required number of school days; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to crediting the required number of school days against schools closed during a state of emergency.

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1 (b) (1)If a county board submits a written application to the State Board 2 that describes a demonstrated effort by the county board to comply with subsection 3 (a) of this section, the State Board may permit: 4 (i) Adjustments in the length of the school year; 5 Exceptions from the requirement that the school year be (ii) 6 completed within a 10-month period; 7 Adjustments in the length of the school day; and (iii) 8 (iv) Schools to be open on holidays. 9 (2)These adjustments may be granted only if normal school attendance 10 is prevented because of: 11 (i) Natural disaster; 12 (ii) Civil disaster; or 13 (iii) Severe weather conditions. 14 Education funding from State or local sources may not be reduced if (3) 15 there are less than 180 school days in any year because of an approved application 16 under this subsection. 17 (4)In case of emergency, the State Board may open schools on holidays. 25 elect to operate one or more schools within the county or Baltimore City on a

26 year-round basis, provided that the 180 day and the minimum hour requirements

27 under this section are met.

28 Nothing in this section precludes a county board from conducting a (2)29 year-round pilot study or program that is funded by the county board.
