## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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### **State Personnel - Teleworking Implementation Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Teleworking Implementation Program; requiring

4 the Secretary of Budget and Management to establish a telework policy for

5 agencies in the Executive Branch of State government; requiring each agency in

6 the Executive Branch of State government to submit a telework plan to the

7 Department of Budget and Management; specifying the contents of the telework

8 plan; requiring each agency to offer a certain percentage of eligible employees

9 the opportunity to telework by a certain date; authorizing an agency to use

10 funds appropriated for the Program for certain purposes; requiring an agency to

11 make certain certifications before expending certain funds; requiring an agency

12 to provide teleworking employees with certain electronic documents; requiring

13 an agency to adopt certain regulations and guidelines; requiring the Secretary to

14 annually submit a certain report; and generally relating to the Teleworking

15 Implementation Program.

### Preamble

23 WHEREAS, Workers are an organization's greatest asset and offering a 24 telework option can help recruit and retain valued employees; and

25 WHEREAS, When employees work in more convenient locations, time lost from

26 sick days, late arrivals, and stressful commutes is converted into productive work 27 periods; and

28 WHEREAS, Technology is changing the workplace both in terms of where work 29 is done and how it is done; and

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1 WHEREAS, Maryland's communities can benefit from teleworking, which gives 2 workers more time to spend at home with their families; and

WHEREAS, Having fewer commuters on the roads, especially at peak hours,
lowers the cost of road maintenance and the demand for building new highways and
improves the quality of life for residents; and

6 WHEREAS, Fewer or shorter commutes mean less air pollution and the 7 conservation of gasoline and other energy sources; and

8 WHEREAS, By lowering the wasted economic cost of traffic congestion and
9 making the State a more attractive place in which to live and do business,
10 teleworking can improve the State's overall economic health; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OFMARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 SUBTITLE 8. TELEWORKING IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAM.

**Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

# 4 EACH AGENCY IN THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT SHALL5 ADOPT REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROGRAM.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December

7 1 of each year, the Secretary of Budget and Management shall submit a report to the

8 Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, in

9 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, concerning the effect of the

10 Program within each agency in the Executive Branch of State government and each

11 agency's progress in meeting the telework goals required by this Act.

12 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 13 effect July 1, 2004.
