12 ethnic, and gender diversity on the Task Force Committee.

13 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

14 July 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June

15 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be

16 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
