A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety - Emergency Expenditures - Nation's Capital First Responder**
3 **Preparedness District**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Director of the Maryland Emergency Management
5 Agency to allocate at least a certain percentage of certain federal money
6 received by the State to the Nation's Capital First Responder Preparedness
7 District; specifying that the District consists of certain counties; requiring that
8 money that is allocated to the District be distributed in a certain manner and
9 used for certain purposes; and generally relating to the allocation of federal
10 emergency money to the Nation's Capital First Responder Preparedness
11 District.

22 Preamble

23 WHEREAS, Charles County, Frederick County, Montgomery County, and
24 Prince George's County are the four Maryland counties that are closest to
25 Washington, D.C., our nation's capital; and

26 WHEREAS, If an emergency or period of heightened alert occurs in
27 Washington, D.C., police, fire, medical, and rescue personnel as well as other "first
28 responders" from those four counties would be among the first on the scene to assist
29 in coping with the situation; and

1 WHEREAS, An emergency or period of heightened alert in Washington, D.C.,
2 would likely affect the residents of those four counties more directly than it would
3 affect the residents of other Maryland counties; and

4 WHEREAS, Because of their location, those four counties deserve to be
5 recognized as the "Nation's Capital First Responder Preparedness District"; and

6 WHEREAS, First responders in the Nation's Capital First Responder
7 Preparedness District should receive additional resources to protect the public peace,
8 health, and safety, and to preserve lives and property should an emergency or period
9 of heightened alert occur in Washington, D.C.; now, therefore,

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 **Article - Public Safety**

13 14-101.

14 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

15 (b) "Director" means the Director of MEMA.

16 (f) "MEMA" means the Maryland Emergency Management Agency.

17 14-112.

18 (a) (1) Expenditures necessitated by emergencies shall first be made using
19 money regularly appropriated to State and local agencies.

20 (2) If the Governor finds that regularly appropriated money is
21 inadequate to cope with an emergency, the Board of Public Works may make
22 contingency money available in accordance with the State budget.

23 (b) [The] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, THE State may:

24 (1) accept any allotment of federal money and commodities and manage
25 and dispose of them in whatever manner may be required by federal law; and

26 (2) take advantage of the federal Disaster Relief Act of 1974 and any
27 amendments or supplements to it, and any other federal law that provides grants and
28 public assistance for the purposes of this subtitle and Subtitles 2 and 4 of this title.

29 (c) (1) In carrying out this subtitle, the Governor, Adjutant General, and
30 executive officers or governing bodies of the political subdivisions shall use the
31 services, equipment, supplies, and facilities of existing agencies and units of the State
32 and the political subdivisions to the maximum extent practicable.

33 (2) The officers and personnel of the agencies and units of the State and
34 the political subdivisions shall cooperate with and extend services and facilities to the

1 Governor, Adjutant General, Director, and the local organizations for emergency
2 management on request.

3 (3) At the direction of the Governor, the Maryland National Guard shall
4 use its services, equipment, supplies, and facilities in life-threatening emergencies
5 that are beyond the capabilities of local authorities.

6 (d) (1) [If] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, IF the federal
7 government, another state, or an agency or officer of the federal government or
8 another state offers to this State or a political subdivision services, equipment,
9 supplies, materials, or money by way of gift, grant, or loan for purposes of emergency
10 management, the State acting through the Governor, or the political subdivision
11 acting with the consent of the Governor and through its executive officer or governing
12 body, may:

13 (i) accept the offer; and

14 (ii) authorize an officer of this State or the political subdivision to
15 receive the services, equipment, supplies, materials, or money.

16 (2) If a person offers to the State or a political subdivision aid or
17 assistance, the State or political subdivision may accept the aid and assistance in
18 accordance with paragraph (1) of this subsection.

19 (E) (1) THE DIRECTOR SHALL ALLOCATE AT LEAST 5% OF ANY FEDERAL
20 MONEY RECEIVED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OR (D) OF THIS SECTION TO THE NATION'S
21 CAPITAL FIRST RESPONDER PREPAREDNESS DISTRICT, WHICH CONSISTS OF
22 CHARLES COUNTY, FREDERICK COUNTY, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, AND PRINCE
23 GEORGE'S COUNTY.

24 (2) MONEY ALLOCATED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SECTION SHALL
25 BE:

26 (I) DISTRIBUTED EQUALLY AMONG THE COUNTIES; AND

27 (II) USED FOR EMERGENCY PLANNING, RISK ASSESSMENTS,
28 EQUIPMENT, TRAINING, EXERCISES, AND OVERTIME EXPENSES INCURRED DURING
29 EMERGENCIES OR PERIODS OF HEIGHTENED ALERT.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
31 effect October 1, 2004.
