4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain persons, without being admitted to practice 5 law in the State, to represent certain contractors in an expedited procedure 6 before the State Board of Contract Appeals; providing that certain requirements 7 related to the practice of law in the State do not limit the right of certain persons 8 to represent certain contractors in these proceedings; clarifying that a person 9 may be represented by counsel in an appeal before the Appeals Board; providing 10 for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to legal representation for 11 a contractor in an expedited procedure before the State Board of Contract 12 Appeals.

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Business Occupations and Professions** 2 10-102. 3 This title does not limit the right of: an individual to appear on the individual's own behalf before a court 4 5 or other unit of the State government; 6 (2) a title insurance company to examine and to insure titles to real 7 property; a collection company to engage in the business of collecting or (3) 9 adjusting commercial claims; [or] a lawyer who is employed on a regular salaried basis by a corporation 11 to represent the corporation before a court or other unit of the State government; OR 12 AN INDIVIDUAL TO REPRESENT A CONTRACTOR IN AN EXPEDITED (5) 13 PROCEDURE BEFORE THE STATE BOARD OF CONTRACT APPEALS UNDER § 15-213 OF 14 THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE. 15 **Article - State Finance and Procurement** 16 15-213. 17 (A) A PERSON MAY BE REPRESENTED BY COUNSEL IN AN APPEAL BEFORE 18 THE APPEALS BOARD. A SOLE PROPRIETOR, CORPORATE OFFICER OR DIRECTOR, GENERAL 19 (B) 20 PARTNER, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY MEMBER, PERSON WITH AT LEAST 10% 21 OWNERSHIP, OR OTHER PRINCIPAL OF A CONTRACTOR, WHO HAS NOT BEEN 22 ADMITTED TO PRACTICE LAW IN THE STATE, MAY REPRESENT THAT CONTRACTOR IN 23 AN EXPEDITED PROCEDURE BEFORE THE APPEALS BOARD.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

25 October 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of 26 September 30, 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this

27 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
