	WHEREAS, One of the stated values of the Mental Hygiene Administration is that, "services should be provided in the least restrictive, most normative, and most appropriate setting"; and

L.C. decision that, "under Title II of the Americans With Disabilities Act, States are required to provide community-based treatment for persons with mental disabilities in community settings when the State's treatment professionals have determined that such placement is appropriate, the affected persons do not oppose such treatment, and the placement can be reasonably accommodated, taking into account the resources available to the State"; and
