# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Higher Education - University System of Maryland - Governing Authority

3 FOR the purpose of providing that the authority of the Board of Regents of the

- 4 University System of Maryland may not be superseded by any State agency or
- 5 office in certain management affairs except by a provision of law that
- 6 specifically references the University System of Maryland; repealing a certain
- 7 limitation on the number of positions that may be created; and generally
- 8 relating to the governing authority of the University System of Maryland.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## Article - Education

23 12-102.

- 24 (a) (1) There is a body corporate and politic known as the University System
- 25 of Maryland.
- 26 (2) The University is an instrumentality of the State and a public
- 27 corporation.

(3) The University is an independent unit of State government. (4) The exercise by the University of the powers conferred by this 3 subtitle is the performance of an essential public function. 4 12-104. In addition to any other powers granted and duties imposed by this title, (a) 6 and subject to the provisions of Title 11 and any other restriction [expressly] imposed 7 by law[.] BY SPECIFIC REFERENCE TO THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND, or 8 by any trust agreement involving a pledge of property or money, the Board of Regents 9 has the powers and duties set forth in this section.

10 (b) In addition to the powers set forth elsewhere in this title, the University 11 may:

12 (1)Exercise all the corporate powers granted Maryland corporations 13 under the Maryland general corporation law;

14 (2)Adopt and alter an official seal;

Sue and be sued, complain, and defend in all courts; 15 (3)

Maintain an office at the place the Board of Regents may designate; 16 (4)

17 Enter into contracts of any kind, and execute all instruments (5)18 necessary or convenient with respect to its carrying out the powers in this subtitle to 19 accomplish the purposes of the University;

20 (6)Subject to the provisions of subsection (h) of this section, acquire, 21 hold, lease, use, encumber, transfer, exchange, or dispose of real and personal 22 property;

23 Borrow money from any source to acquire personal property as (7)24 provided in § 12-105(c) of this subtitle; and

25 (8)In addition to the powers set forth in Title 19 of this article and 26 subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works, borrow money from any source 27 for any corporate purpose, including working capital for its operations, reserve funds 28 or interest, and mortgage, pledge, or otherwise encumber the property or funds of the 29 University, and contract with or engage the services of any person in connection with 30 any financing, including financial institutions, issuers of credit, or insurers.

31 (c) The Board of Regents:

32 Is responsible for the management of the University System of (1)33 Maryland and has all the powers, rights, and privileges that go with that 34 responsibility, including the power to conduct or maintain any institutions, schools, or 35 departments in the University at the locations the Board determines;

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1 (2)Shall consult with the presidents in developing policies, guidelines, 2 and plans for the University System of Maryland; and 3 (3)May not be superseded in its authority by any other State agency or 4 office in managing the affairs of the University System of Maryland or of any 5 constituent institutions and centers under the Board's jurisdiction. 6 By September 1 of each year, the Board shall submit an annual position (1)7 accountability report to the Department of Budget and Management, Department of 8 Legislative Services, the Maryland Higher Education Commission, and, in accordance 9 with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly, reporting the 10 total positions created and the cost and the funding source for any positions created 11 by the University in the previous fiscal year. 12 12-108. 13 (a) (1) The Board of Regents shall appoint a Chancellor of the University 14 System of Maryland. 15 The Chancellor is the Chief Executive Officer of the University (2)16 System of Maryland and the Chief of Staff for the Board. 17 The Chancellor may: (c) Have the additional staff provided in the University budget; and 18 (1)19 (2)(i) Create any position within the system administration office and 20 within existing funds available to the system administration office, to the extent the 21 cost of the position, including the cost of any fringe benefits, is funded from existing 22 funds. 23 (ii) This paragraph may not be construed to require any additional 24 State General Fund support. The total number of positions authorized under this paragraph 25 (iii) 26 shall be limited as specified annually in the State budget bill. 27 12-109.

(a) In consultation with the Chancellor and after a thorough search, the Board
of Regents shall appoint a qualified person as president of each constituent
institution.

31 (e) Subject to the authority and applicable regulations and policies of the32 Board of Regents, each president shall:

33 (5) Subject to the provisions of subsection (g) of this section, have 34 authority to create any position within existing funds available to the University, to 35 the extent the cost of the position, including the cost of any fringe benefits, is funded 36 from existing funds;

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1 (g) [(1)] Subsection (e)(5) of this section may not be construed to require any 2 additional State General Fund support.

3 [(2) The total number of positions authorized under subsection (e)(5) of 4 this section shall be limited as specified annually in the State budget bill.]

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 6 effect July 1, 2004.
