- 24 WHEREAS, The General Assembly declares that it is necessary to enable the
- 25 adolescent children of Maryland's poor and working-poor families, especially at-risk
- 26 14- to 15-year-olds who have little or no experience with the attitudes, expectations,
- 27 and social/occupational skills necessary to function competitively as part of
- 28 Maryland's workforce, to obtain a paid summer job, practical on-the-job experience in
- 29 meeting employer expectations, and familiarity with the daily demands of a work
- 30 environment; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The General Assembly declares that it is necessary to provide youth
- 2 from low-income or working-poor families who have limited or no access to private
- 3 sector summer employment due to age, lack of transportation, disabilities, or other
- 4 special needs, with the opportunity to earn needed income at a meaningful summer
- 5 job; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The General Assembly declares that it is necessary to provide
- 7 economically depressed communities the opportunity to maintain neighborhood
- 8 stability by providing productive activities for their teenaged children during the
- 9 summer months; and
- WHEREAS, The General Assembly declares that it is necessary to allow State
- 11 and local governments, private nonprofit agencies, and community organizations to
- 12 expand their supply of summer workers and to serve as on-the-job mentors to
- 13 disadvantaged teens; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The General Assembly declares that it is necessary to provide
- 15 at-risk teens with a "first job" in order to foster the development of a work ethic and
- 16 a commitment to self-sufficiency through employment; now, therefore,
- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
