3 FOR the purpose of repealing the termination date of a certain provision of law

- 4 establishing vision requirements for holders of a Class C noncommercial driver's
- 5 license; and generally relating to vision requirements and drivers' licenses.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Transportation 2 16-110.3. 3 (a) The Administration may only issue a restricted Class C noncommercial 4 driver's license to an applicant who does not otherwise meet the vision standards 5 under § 16-110.1 of this subtitle but: 6 (1)Has simultaneously: A visual acuity of worse than 20/70, but no worse than 20/100, (i) 8 in one or both eyes as determined by the Administration in consultation with the 9 Medical Advisory Board; and 10 (ii) A continuous field of vision of at least 110 degrees and with at 11 least 35 degrees lateral to the midline of each side; and 12 (2)Is recommended for consideration for licensure by the applicant's 13 licensed ophthalmologist or optometrist in accordance with subsection (b) of this 14 section and regulations of the Administration concerning limited vision licenses. 15 (b) The ophthalmologist's or optometrist's recommendation for an applicant 16 seeking a license under this section shall be based on the best standard spectacle or contact lens correction in the applicant's better eye. 17 18 The Administration shall refer any application for a license under (c) (1)19 this section to the Medical Advisory Board appointed under § 16-118 of this subtitle 20 for review. Unless the Medical Advisory Board determines that it can make a 21 (2)22 favorable recommendation to the Administration based on the record before it, the 23 Board shall offer the applicant an opportunity to appear before the Board to present 24 medical information pertinent to the Board's review. 25 An applicant who chooses to appear before the Medical Advisory (3)26 Board may be accompanied by the applicant's ophthalmologist or optometrist or by any other individual to assist the applicant in presenting pertinent medical 27 28 information to the Board. 29 (4) An appearance before the Medical Advisory Board is not a matter 30 subject to the contested case provisions under Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State 31 Government Article. (d) 32 (1)An applicant seeking a license under this section shall successfully 33 complete a driver's training course in accordance with regulations of the 34 Administration.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall

4 take effect October 1, 1997. [Section 16-110.3 of the Transportation Article, as

5 enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and, at

6 the end of September 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General

7 Assembly, § 16-110.3 of the Transportation Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act

8 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 July 1, 2004.
