3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for

4 Baltimore City to determine under certain circumstances the time during which

5 a license may be deemed unexpired; requiring the Board to give a licensee a

6 certain notice within a certain time after the closing of the licensee's business or

7 the cessation of certain alcoholic beverages business operations; allowing a

8 licensee to make a request under certain circumstances for an extension of a

9 license on the grounds that an undue hardship caused a certain business closing

10 or cessation of certain business operations; requiring the Board to hold certain

11 hearings and to grant certain extensions of time under certain circumstances;

12 specifying that a license expires on a certain day under certain circumstances; 13 requiring the Board to give a certain notice to a holder of a license that expired

14 on or before a certain date; requiring the Board to determine whether a certain

15 license should be deemed unexpired and, if so, the terms and conditions of its

16 unexpired status; requiring a secured creditor to sell a certain license within a

17 certain time; specifying the time for calculating the expiration date of a certain

18 license; making stylistic and technical changes; altering a defined term; and

19 generally relating to the expiration of alcoholic beverages licenses in Baltimore
